He created the Lost In Michigan, website posting photos and stories of the interesting places that he had found. His work has been featured in the Detroit Free Press and the Lansing State Journal. He is also considered a "Michigan Expert" by USA Today and has contributed to their Top Ten List of Michigan. In the fall of 2017, he published his first book based on the posts on his website. He still continues to travel around Michigan looking for unique places and telling their stories.

**Library Funding Q & A...
Penal Fines**

In 1963, a new law, allowed for portions of fines collected through the courts from criminal and speeding violations, along with civil infractions to support local libraries across Michigan.

If you get a speeding ticket in the area served by a library—the library is given a portion of that fine.

This distribution is based on the size of the population that is served by each library.
