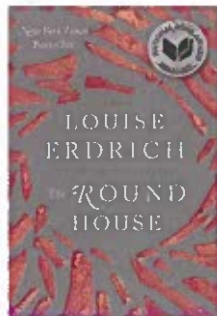

The Round House

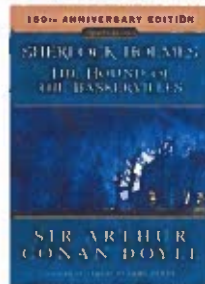
